

Electronic Music & Video Workshop

Samuel Newman will be visiting the students at Pia in week 2 of term one next year where they will participate in using an array of synthesisers, vocal effects units, electronic drum kits and other that contemporary electronic musicians use in their productions. The process involves some rhythm, melody and lyrical exercises and the students will collaborate on a song and develop a music video that they can share with friends and family.

Samuel Newman is the owner and operator of **Making Noise**. He is a multiaward winning musician who has toured Australia extensively as a founding member and trombonist in Koi Child, among other projects. Throughout this time he has also managed art studios and gallery spaces and created audiovisual installations for various festivals. Over the years he's collected all sorts of music equipment and software in pursuit of making weird and wonderful sound. With his experience and collection, Sam decided to start developing the concept of Making Noise. He has worked at schools across the state, youth centres and with people living with disability doing various music productions and tutoring programs.
